THE IMPORTANCE OF TEXAS LANGUAGE EDUCATION

- More than 160 different languages are spoken in Texas
- 8.6 million (35.6%) Texas citizens are speakers of a non-English language, which is higher than the national average of 22%.
- 1 in 3 Texans speak a language other than English at home.
- "Bilingual" ranked in the Texas Workforce Commission's "Top 20 Employability Skills".

LANGUAGE EDUCATION IN THE LONE STAR STATE

Texas residents make up 14% of the total U.S. Limited English Proficient population.

16 languages are currently taught in Texas public schools with over a million students enrolled in those classes.

Texas students can receive a Performance Acknowledgement on their high school diploma for showing proficiency in English and another language.

AP Spanish Language and Culture is one of the few AP courses offered to 8th graders in Texas.
